Metcalf PTO Program/Event Descriptions

FALL 2010 ACTIVITIES/EVENTS

PTO Welcome Coffee (August 23, 2010)

The beginning of the school year always starts with the PTO Welcome Coffee. On the morning of the first day of school, volunteers set up in the small gym with coffee and snacks. Parents are welcome to meet and greet while enjoying snacks and relaxing while the students get started in their new year.

Fall Family Picnic (September 24, 2010)

The Family Picnic is a great way to start off the school year and get to know other parents. The picnic includes sandwiches, drinks and potluck for dinner; games for fun; and a walk over to U-High for a football game for those interested.

Fall Festival (October 29, 2010)

For children in Preschool - Second Grade to celebrate the Fall Season. This event is usually on the last Friday in October during the afternoon. Games, snacks and entertainment are all part of the fun! Past themes have included cowboy games, clowns, face painting, rodeo games, races, singers and more.

Holiday Bazaar (December 9, 2010 set-up) AND (December 10, 2100- event)

The Holiday Bazaar team collects gift items from families (gently used items from homes or sale items from stores) to create a Holiday Store where the students can shop. The students are able to purchase gifts (25 cents an item) for each immediate family member, have them wrapped, and bring them home to surprise their families over the holiday break. The students love surprising their families and feel great about providing gifts on their own! You can donate gently used items throughout the year in the main office.

SPRING 2011 ACTIVITIES/EVENTS

Winter Festival 2010-2011 MAJOR FUNDRAISER (February 25, 2011)

(Combination of former Chili Dinner and Gym & Swim)

This “new” event will take the best of both the chilli supper and the gym & swim and produce a fun-filled evening including a silent auction, dinner, games, swimming, and lots of great prizes. Something for everyone! *** The MONTAGE and the WINTER FESTIVAL/ABSENTEA are held in alternating years.

Mini-Courses/Career Day

During the first week in February students are offered a morning to attend unique classes. The Mini-Courses are for students from Kindergarten through 5th Grade, while Career Day is for students from 6th to 8th grade. Parents volunteer to teach classes in which they have some expertise. Classes range from Home Design to Hair Braiding, Sciences to Acting. Something for everyone!

School Play Reception

The Play is a major Metcalf event. Students try out to participate in the play (age ranges vary from year to year depending on the play selected) and all students are given the opportunity to attend the play during the school day. The play is also performed Friday and Saturday night and Sunday afternoon for the families to enjoy. The cast and crew put on a wonderful show not only for the student body but also for families and friends. The PTO sponsors the Play Reception to show our appreciation for the dedicated work throughout the entire Play process.

Junior Gamma Phi Circus Reception

The Junior Gamma Phi Circus is a major Metcalf event. Students can participate after they have reached 3rd grade. It is amazing to see how quickly the students pick up on the traits of the great circus performers and how wonderfully they entertain their fans with trapeze artistry, juggling, rollerblading stunts and other acts of circus showmanship. The PTO sponsors the Circus Reception in order to celebrate the dedicated work of all the volunteers.

8TH Grade Graduation Reception

The 8th Grade Graduation is a wonderful tradition at Metcalf. Most of our students have been in class together since kindergarten, many since preschool. The PTO and Administration work together with the parents to provide a Graduation Ceremony, Video, Reception and Dance. *The Graduation Planning is a combined effort of the 7th and 8th grade parents.*

ON-GOING ACTIVITIES/EVENTS

Staff Appreciation:

Metcalf PTO shows gratitude to the teachers through appreciation days throughout the school year. These days include foods and beverages donated by the Metcalf families. This is a very nice and well appreciated program that the teachers really love and deserve.

Lost and Found:

The Lost and Found is a collection of items found on the playgrounds, in the hallways, locker rooms and classrooms at Metcalf. The Lost and Found piles up several times throughout the year. Volunteers have been attempting to keep the lost and found clutter free in order to provide an opportunity for items to be found. Please clearly write your Last Name in your child's important clothing - especially coats, sweatshirts and winter accessories. We try to return clothing and books directly to students when owners can be identified. We will clean out the Lost and Found at the end of each quarter in order to keep it from overflowing. Directory “GOING GREEN”

ABSENTEA

The Absentea Fundraiser is held in conjunction with the Winter Festival Fundraiser. This program allows families a no-hassle way to donate funds. Families can choose to donate a monetary amount.

Montage:

Montage is held bi-annually and is the larger of the two major fundraisers. The next Montage will be held in February 2012 (with planning starting in the spring of 2011). Montage is a wonderful night out for our families and includes food, beverages, a silent auction, a loud auction, music and fun.

This is a great night that really brings our families together in the spirit of building an even greater Metcalf Experience! Montage generally adds \$20,000 to \$25,000 to the PTO budget and allows for major purchases such as the climbing wall and teacher grants.

Artworks

The PTO works with the Artworks program as a small fundraiser and a family benefit. Families are given the opportunity to purchase their children’s artwork in various forms (magnets, shirts, quilt patches, etc) from the Artworks company. Artwork samples and order forms will be provided to families during the school year.

Boxtops for Education

Boxtops is a great and simple PTO fundraiser. Each family is asked to cut Boxtops from their food products and send them to the classrooms. Each year a contest is held between the classes to encourage Boxtop collection. The 3 winning classes receive a Pizza Party paid for by the PTO. This is a great way to earn some extra money with very little fundraising efforts from our families. Ask your family members (grandparents, etc to get involved and save too, they love to help and kids love the mail!) Registering offers families opportunities to get coupons on line, enter Boxtops contests and shop at Boxtop vendors.

Campbell's UPC Codes

Metcalf earns a percentage of your purchase. For Campbell's products such as soup, goldfish, Prego, etc, cut off the UPC codes and send them in with your children when submitting boxtops. Market Day

Market Day is a great way for Metcalf Families to shop for frozen foods while earning money for the school. Metcalf PTO volunteers work to collect orders and provide a convenient pick up process. Sign up for a Community Rewards card at a Meijer store or online at Meijer.com <http://www.meijer.com/rewards>. Our code is 446136. Metcalf will receive a percentage of each purchase. You can either link your Meijer Master Card or sign up for a Meijer 1 card or shop with cash or pin-based debit card.

Target TakeCharge of Education

Target will donate a percentage of your purchase to Metcalf each time you use your Target Visa or RedCard. Sign up on Target RedCards website <https://sites.target.com/site/en/corporate/page.jsp?contentId=PRD03-005174> . Our school ID is 44900. We have earned over \$2,800 since 1997.

MyCokeRewards

There are points on every 12 pack, 24 packs and single lids of all Coke products. Go to Mycokerewards.com to sign up for an account. After you sign up for an account you can enter codes in the top left corner of the web site. To donate points to Metcalf click on Spend Points, then Donate to Your School. Type in 61790 in the zip code to pick Metcalf. PTO can use the points to shop from the school catalog which include school supplies and PE equipment.

Office Depot

The Metcalf PTO is working with Office Depot to offer our school supplies. Parents are welcome to shop for supplies at any store, but are encouraged to shop at Office Depot due to their bonus program. **Office Depot** will provide payback to the school for all items purchased throughout the year. Tell the cashier you are supporting Thomas Metcalf School when you checkout. Our code is 70032812. The cashier can also look it up at the register. Metcalf will receive 5% of your purchase.

SpiritWear

Metcalf PTO offers SpiritWear to encourage school spirit. A variety of items will be available at registration for immediate purchase and take home. We will also have order forms available. Students are encouraged to show their school spirit daily, but especially on all Fridays! Drop gently used spirit wear in the office any time during the year.

Note: All gym wear can be purchased through Reed's Sporting Goods. Students will be asked to have their names on the Exterior of the clothing (**Shirts – Front or Back, Shorts – Front Only**) The names will help the PTO, Gym Teachers and/or Janitors return lost clothing to the proper owners – this should help save parents money..yeah!

Matching Gifts

Donations made to Metcalf School through the ISU Foundation for PTO qualify for Matching Funds from many local companies. The donation must be \$25 or more to qualify. If you have questions, please contact the PTO Treasurer.

Company Grants

Some companies offer grants for volunteering a certain amount of hours to non-profit organizations. Check with your employer to see if they offer this benefit. Grants to be given to PTO can be designated for the "Metcalf Parent Enhancement Fund".

Teacher Grants

Metcalf PTO's largest expenditure is for the Teacher Grants which averages around \$25,000 a year. Each teacher is asked to provide requests for items needed within their classrooms or within the school. PTO reviews all requests and provides for as many requests as possible. The PTO works with parents, teachers and the administration to determine the greatest and most effective needs.
